Procedure:

The Garrison Safety Office offers All Terrain Vehicle (ATV) and Dirt Bike Training to Soldiers and Civilians at Ft. Irwin. **All Military must take the ATV/Dirt Bike course if riding on or off post.** Civilians must take the course if they are to ride on post.

The following steps must be taken prior to signing up for a course:

1. Go to [www.irwin.army.mil](http://www.irwin.army.mil)
2. Click on "Garrison" on left side of website.
3. Go down to Safety and then click on "ATV/Dirt Bike Class".
4. The dates for each class are shown. Read all information on the page prior to enrolling in a course.

NOTE: Before enrolling in a course the following curriculum must be met:

- Show up at least 15 minutes prior to start time. Courses run approximately 4 hrs.
- Dirt bike must have a working kick stand, triangle, or other stand.
- ALL riders must have a Department of Transportation (DOT) approved helmet, long sleeve shirt, long pants, work boots (above the ankle), or military equivalent issued boots full fingered gloves, and form fitting goggles.
- Children between the ages 6 and 11 and children between the ages 12 and 16 will be given special instruction. Parental or legal guardian must be present during training. Consent waiver and liability for must be completed and signed.
- All riders must do a proper preventive maintenance check according to the operators manual for that particular dirt bike or ATV prior to coming to the course. Insure that all fluid levels including fuel is topped off. If the instructor determines that the dirt bike or ATV is unsafe to operate, the vehicle will not be allowed on the course.
- If a Civilian is signed up for a course and a Soldier wants to take the training, the Civilian will be re-scheduled for another course date.

NOTE: If no one is signed up for the Dirt Bike course, the ATV course will be at 0830 instead of 1300 hrs.

5. Call 380-7708 to enroll in a course.
6. All riders must give their name, rank, age, unit, and a phone number where they can be reached.
7. A 2 day cancellation notice is required.

NOTE: All course dates are subject to change or can be cancelled. The Instructor will notify everyone signed up for the course prior to the date or time.
