6. **TERRAIN FAMILIARIZATION & HAZARD ORIENTATION: _____OCs initials**

- a. OCA Student must demonstrate their knowledge of the terrain in the maneuver box.
- b. OCA Student must receive an orientation from the certified OC on hazardous terrain encountered in the maneuver box to include such items as washouts, wades, and high narrow roadways.
- c. OCA Student must receive an orientation from the certified OC on the hazards of speeding and the proper speed limits within the maneuver box.
